
Below is a short history of the impact that Ron and June had with our Club.

Short History of the ISOC Vic (taken from President, Fred Wright's speech)

This great club that was started by Ron Thomas's initiative many years ago has always tried to operate along the lines of what was originally intended. It has been family oriented, social and great to be in, all the things I believe Ron (& June) and the founding members envisaged.

In August 1990 a letter was sent out by Ron Thomas to ascertain the level of interest in starting a Victorian division of The International Scout Owners Club. That was followed a month later to those who had replied with an invitation to meet at Picnic Point, Longwarry to consider a club format and how it should operate. Ron became the Inaugural President ably supported by June. Right from the start of the club at the end of 1991 there is mention of Ron and June putting together a Christmas hamper to raffle for Club funds and June baking a cake for the 1st anniversary of the Club. June arranged Christmas hampers and Christmas cakes up until Ron got very ill in 2009.
