One Member's trip report. Scout National Gathering in the Flinders Ranges report - Apr 2013

14 people in 8 vehicles [4 Scouts] met at Brim near Warracknabeal (Vic) and headed off in convoy to the Biennial International Scout State Clubs get together - Touring through Murrayville, Cadell, Mount Mary, Burra Gorge and Laura at a leisurely pace with plenty of time to do the tourist thing.

We arrived at Melrose caravan park on April Fool's day for the start of the official tour and re-acquainted ourselves with some of the members from the other states. Some of whom we had met before but there were some new faces. After 3 days there touring the Southern Flinders areas we moved to Merna Mora. This was a



working station with camping and from there we toured the middle section of Flinders [pictured]. One stormy night we had a meal at the Prairie Hotel at Parachilna which was a pleasant experience although it was a long trip in the bus dodging Roos coming back.
